THE AIM OF THE PROGRAMME

To provide basic knowledge relating to the functions of a blood centre.

- Describe the methods used during blood donation, component preparation, testing and distribution of donated blood
- Understand the relationship between 'patient facing' and 'donor facing' departments and how they support NHSBT activities

- A brief explanation of the purpose of blood collection and processing, testing and distribution of blood and blood products
- A brief overview of Diagnostics & Therapeutic Services and Organ Donation & Transplantation
